Congratulations! Your firm has been certified as a Participant in the U.S. Small Business Administration's (SBA) 8(a) BD program. Your nine (9) year program term begins on the date of this letter.

Additionally, your firm has been certified as a Small Disadvantaged Business (SDB) in the Federal Government's SDB program. Your term of participation in the SDB program is concurrent with your 8(a) BD certification.

During participation in the 8(a) program, you will receive business development assistance from an assigned Business Opportunity Specialist in the Washington, D.C. District Office located at 1110 Vermont Avenue, NW, Suite 900, Washington, D.C. 20036. The phone number is 202/606-4000. The District office will also be able to provide you with information on the SDB program and its benefits.

Your firm will become eligible to receive 8(a) contracts after you submit a business plan using SBA Form 1010C and receive SBA's approval of the plan. We are sending a copy of this certification letter to the SBA Washington, D.C. District Office. That office will send you the business plan form.

SBA requires that the President or Chief Executive Officer sign a Participation Agreement to show that he or she understands the conditions of 8(a) program participation. Please read the Agreement carefully, sign and date one copy and return it to the SBA Washington, D.C. District Office at the address shown in the third paragraph above. The second copy is for you.

Even though your firm's approved North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code is 541511; your firm may be awarded contracts under other NAICS Codes, as long as the firm is qualified to perform. In this regard, please note that contracts awarded under 8(a) BD program authority generally result from the self-marketing efforts of the 8(a) firm. While your firm's acceptance into the 8(a) BD program is not a guarantee of contract support, SBA will make every effort to provide you with assistance in your marketing efforts.

If you have not already done so, we strongly suggest that you acquire access to e-mail to enhance your communication abilities with public and private sector buyers. Also, you should consider setting up a merchant account with a credit card company which will give you the ability to accept credit card orders for your goods and services from over 1,000 Federal buying offices. Finally, please contact your local SBA District Office to update your enrollment in PRO-Net, an SBA online procurement listing of small businesses utilized by public and private sector buyers.

We welcome you as an 8(a) program participant and look forward to working with you.

Your 8(a) Business Plan has been approved. For reporting purposes, your program year begins on September 1, through August 31. Your program term ends on September 5, 2011.

You will be required to review this plan with your assigned Business Opportunity Specialist (BOS) annually. Prior to the end of the current program year, you will be sent an 8(a) Annual Update Form for completion.

Your firm's approved Primary North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS) Code is 541511. The U.S. Small Business Administration approves the primary NAICS Code. Your firm may be awarded contracts under other NAICS Codes as long as the firm is qualified to perform.

SBA will do its best to provide support at the approved levels, but SBA does not guarantee support in any amount or at any level. Support levels will be used for planning and forecasting but the level approved will not prevent contract awards above that level.

Per 13 CFR 124.312(b)(7), "8(a) and non 8(a) revenues will be monitored using annual financial statements, submitted to SBA within 90 calendar days (120 days for audited statements) from the end of your fiscal year." Financial statements must separate revenue as 8(a) and non 8(a); and 8(a) revenue should be identified as either competitive or non-competitive. You must also provide an annual report of all non 8(a) contracts, options and modifications reflecting price executive during the program year within 30 days from the end of the program.

We also encourage you to utilize all of the counseling programs available to you including the Service Corps of Retired Executives (SCORE), the Small Business Development Centers (SBDCs) and the SBA/Bell Atlantic Business Information Center (BIC).
